Thank you to everyone who participated in the 2024 Virtual Stride event as we marched across Canada.

We started at the beginning of April in Iqualuit, Nunavut, and ended just outside Terrace BC at the end of June. We hit all the Provincial Capitals and were treated to wonderful poetry from Anne Mackenzie-Thompson as we went along our route. We completed 11, 859 kms on our cross-Canada route.

You can see from our Map of Canada that it was a huge undertaking by our 22 striders. Congratulations to Susan Eadie, who was the strider with the most steps at a whopping 1370 kms. As well, Wendy Belcher raised an amazing \$2,414.75!

The Bronte Grandmothers/Oomama Team raised over \$12,442! In all, we walked, ran, swam, gardened, exercised, cleaned house, and completed many other activities to clock over 15 million steps! Congratulations to everyone!

The rally, hosted by GASP, (Grandmothers (and Others) Act to Save the Planet), was attended by Oomamas, GRANs, indigenous women from "Grandmother's Voice," among many others. Everyone sang The Climate Song in front of Oakville's Library and walked down to the Square to sing again.
